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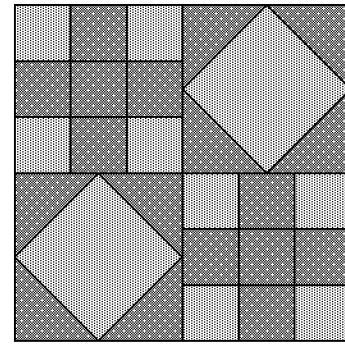
### Fabrics Needed

10 - Dark 2-1/2" squares

8 - Light 2-1/2" squares

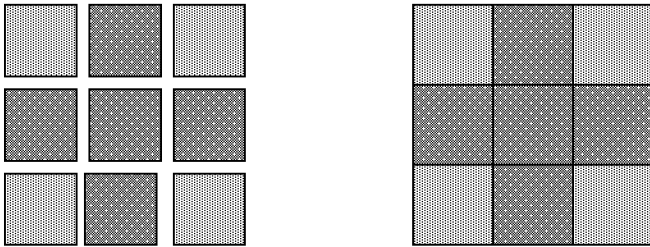
2 - Light 4-3/4" squares

2 - Dark fabrics- Cut two 3-7/8" squares from each and you will have four squares, two of each dark color. Cut these four squares in half on the diagonal to get 8 half triangles.

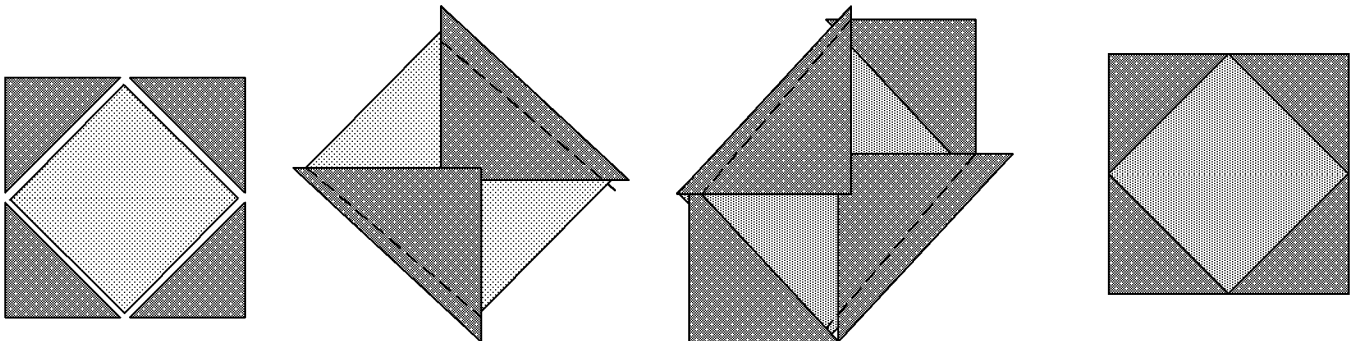


### Assembly

Piece together the 2 nine patches placing the light fabric in the four corners.



Sew the triangle halves onto the sides of each of the 4-3/4" squares.



All four blocks should measure 6-1/2" square.

Lay out the four 6-1/2" pieced blocks as shown below. Stitch top and bottom sections of block. Press seams in opposite directions. Stitch top and bottom sections together matching seams.
