Cut (2) 5-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally
Cut (10) 3-3/8" squares then cut in half diagonally


From White or tone-on-tone white Cut (2) 5-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally Cut (10) 3-3/8" squares then cut in half diagonally

Sew 1 1930's fabric and 1 white small triangle together, each makes a 3" square (make 12 half-square triangles) Press towards 30's fabric.

Layout 3 triangle-squares, 2 small 1930's and 2 white triangles, sew in a vertical row joining the pieces as shown in figure 2. Then sew the pieced sets in a horizontal row.



Sew 1 1930's fabric large triangle to one edge of corn & bean unit (above) and a white to opposite edge. Match the large dark triangle to the small white triangles and the large white triangle to the small dark triangles. (See figure 3) <u>Press to large triangles</u>. Piece should measure 8 inches square.



Make 3 more units. Layout as in figure 4

Sew corn & bean units in pairs, press seams in opposite directions. Join pairs to make a corn & bean block. Finished block should measure 15-1/2" square.
